## Rhode Island Vital Records

-Records of birth, marriage, and death created by local governments -

## Who records them?

In Rhode Island, records are kept on the town level, with duplicate copies to the state.

## When were they kept?

Statewide recording began in 1853.

## How do I access them?

- 1) Older records:
  - *a.* Vital records up to 1850 have been abstracted and indexed as part of the Arnold Collection. An excellent overview is available on the blog *One Rhode Island Family* at <u>https://onerhodeislandfamily.com/free-rhode-island-resources/free-r-i-vital-records/</u>.
  - *b.* Births and marriages covering 1853–1922 and deaths covering 1853–1946 have been digitized by the Rhode Island State Archives at <u>https://sosri.access.preservica.com/uncategorized/SO\_aa84016c-a20c-4a02-8f03-eae14378f70a/</u>.
    - *i.* Deaths up to 1972 can be requested here: <u>https://forms.sos.ri.gov/VitalRecordsOrderForm.aspx</u>.
  - *c.* Other records may be available using the catalog or image search on *FamilySearch.*
- 2) More recent records can be requested from the local clerk or the state Department of Health. Be aware that you will need to be a member of an approved genealogical society (Rhode Island Genealogical Society works) to request a copy of most records.
